

935.02 SEWER SYSTEM CAPACITY CHARGES.

(a) For the purpose of providing funds to help finance and to more equitably distribute the cost of construction of necessary additions to the sewerage system, it is hereby determined and declared to be necessary to provide for the establishment, exaction and regulation of a sanitary sewerage system capacity and connection charge, as hereinafter determined, such charges to be an addition to any and all other fees which may be imposed with respect to the City sewerage system.

(b) The funds received from the collection of such charges shall be deposited daily with the Director of Finance who shall credit them to the Sewer Revenue Fund from which Council may make appropriations for the payment of the cost and expense of the engineering, construction, management and repair of the sanitary sewerage system, regulator chambers, storm standby tanks and pumping stations and for the payment of the cost and expense of replacement, extensions to or enlargement of the same and for the payment of principal and interest on any debt incurred for the construction of such sewerage system, regulator chambers, storm standby tanks and pumping stations.

(c) A sanitary sewerage system capacity charge shall be exacted whenever:

(1) Application is made for the issuance of a sewer permit to provide sanitary sewer service to a new structure; and

(2) An existing structure is enlarged or its use changed, which necessitates a larger water tap.

(d) The charge exacted pursuant to subsection (c) hereof shall be determined in accordance with the following:

Credit for any existing structure which has a use charge or for an existing structure which is enlarged or removed may be applied against the system capacity charge herein imposed in the amount of the original structure charge up to, but not more than, the current charge.
